Chairs update

At our September's meeting we were very happy to co-opt and welcome Mrs Alex Schellenberg onto the Council. There are still two more councillor positions to fill so if anyone is interested please contact either our Clerk, Sarah, or myself for details.

Councillors were very pleased at their Zoom meeting in September to award a grant of £1,000 to Stoke Band for the insurance of their instruments. The Band has had no income since the lockdown started and their concerts have been much missed. Their music brings a lot of pleasure to all the village events run throughout the year and we all look forward to the time when they are able to do so again.

For some time now, some of the jobs that County Highways and the District Council have responsibility for like keeping our roads and pavements weed-free, drains clear etc have not been carried out due to their staff shortages and budget cuts. The parish council has now made a decision to employ a SSDC Parish Ranger (lengthsman) ourselves for a minimum one day each month to carry out these sorts of jobs and to do other small repairs to village assets around the village and when required. This means that we have more control over keeping our village clean and tidy. The Ranger's first job has been to mend the broken gate at Dannings Well in Matts Lane to prevent dogs running through into the road. The next priority is to ensure that all the village road drains are unblocked before the bad weather begins, starting with those in North Street and Ham Hill Road. This Ranger service is a paid service and will come out of our council budget each year. We'll review it quarterly to see how well it's working and to ensure we are addressing the right issues. If there are things that need repairing please get in touch with the Parish Clerk in the normal way.

We've been asked to remind you about the 'Rule of 6'. The new restrictions on **STAY ALERT** social interaction announced on the 14th September mean that all social gatherings indoors and outdoors should be restricted to groups of no more than 6 people. This is to try to slow/reduce the impact of a second

SAVE LIVES wave of COVID-19 before the winter by

limiting the number of people we socially meet at any one time. It really makes sense and though it might be a bit frustrating, it's for everyone's benefit in the end.

There are some exemptions to this rule for COVID-19 Secure community facilities like the Working Men's Club, Memorial Hall, Youth Centre and HCAP where more than one group of 6 can meet indoors, providing the separate groups are socially distanced. Certain activities involving children are also exempt.

All Stoke community venues that are now open are COVID-19 Secure with proper cleaning and structured social distancing measures in place, so it's ok and safe to use these. Finally stay safe and well. Remember - Hands, Face, Space!

TAKING CARE OF HEDGEHOGS

I have for a while had a massive passion for Hedgehogs. I've rescued and released many of these gorgeous animals and have a substantial number in my garden that I feed every night and it is a pleasure to sit and watch them snuffling around.


Unfortunately, Hedgehogs are now on the red list as Vulnerable to Extinction and if the numbers keep declining like they are they could be extinct by 2025 so I'm asking everyone to try and help them if you can. The easiest way is to make a small hole in a fence - 13cm x 13cm - so they can move around from garden to garden instead of going onto roads as they can go 2 miles foraging for food each night.

Milk should not be given to Hedgehogs as they are lactose intolerant. If you would like to feed them dog/cat food and cat biscuits are best, also leave out a shallow dish of water for them. Also, leave a small patch of garden to over grow as that would also be beneficial for them.

If we all did these small things it would help them to build their numbers back up. Please look out for Hedgehogs and help them if you can. Thank you.
