

# PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Parish Council met on Wednesday 4th June, and the public session began with questions about the amount spent on the parish office facility to date, and the Parish Council's decision to engage directly with a provider of youth services in the village. The Council has provided written responses to both these matters.

In case residents aren't aware - the electorate have the right to see any aspect of the council's financial accounts via the public rights process, which is currently 'live' as well as all payments being detailed in published minutes.

The Parish Office is used not only by the Parish Council, but also by various village organisations including Speedwatch, the Residents Associations and also provides the Charity Shop with a storage and stock management facility. The Charity Shop donates to the operating costs of the parish office, and the profit of over £33k in the last financial year – a very impressive achievement – is invested back into the community for the benefit of Stoke residents. As an 'office', it really provides a useful hub for many community endeavours.

The Parish Council is now working directly with Community Youth Project (CYP) to continue to provide a youth club for children aged 8-17 on a Monday evening from 6.30-8.30pm at HYFC. It will run throughout the summer holidays and October half-term, only stopping for a 2 week break over Christmas. At the time of writing, there were 26 children at the most recent session, and they enjoyed various arts and crafts activities. Other matters covered at the meeting included the latest Speedwatch Group data, confirmation that almost all the allotments across all 3 sites are now cleared and enjoyed by over 50 holders, and two volunteers came forward with some relevant experience to help with the Christmas Lights. We will set up a Working Group ready to deliver a twinkling display over the festive period.

The PC surgery will be held as usual on the third Thursday of the month on 17th July - between 10 and 12 noon and again from 6-8pm. During this time, residents can call into the parish office, (Unit 7, North Street Workshops), to talk to one of our councillors. This is a useful way to raise matters with the council.

# **STOKE SUB HAMDON SPORTS & RECREATION TRUST**

We recently carried out a review for the Annual Parish Meeting on 21st May which looked at what we have achieved over the past year and decade. Some interesting figures came out of that review - since 2011 to date we have raised over £458,000 for projects for the sports and recreation facilities for the community, we have also provided over £90,100 in grants to organisations and individuals in the village - a grand total of over £549,100 for the community. This does not include funds raised to help maintain the facilities and grounds at the West Street Recreation Ground, which from 2011 to December 2024 was over £127,000.

All this is achieved through the hard work, innovation and commitment of a dedicated and motivated team of volunteers - and we cannot thank them enough for their time, ideas and support throughout the years - they should be very proud of what they do and what they give back to the village.

The Trust is an entirely volunteer run organisation with 12 people on the Trust Committee, about 40 volunteers on the rota for the Charity Shop, a core of a dozen people on the May Fayre planning committee and about 40 people making it work on the day. This year, to date, the Trust has provided £6,285 in grants to the community - applications for grants can be made through the Trust website - https://stoke-rec-trust.co.uk/. There are too many of you to thank individually but we are so very grateful to you for everything you do to make the May Fayre the success it is. We are still reconciling our accounts but hopefully the amount raised from this year's May Fayre will be in the region of  $\pounds$ 7,000 which is great and will help towards us being able to keep doing some fantastic things in our lovely village.
