PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

All councillors were present at the most recent meeting of the parish council held on Wednesday 5th March and several members of the public and both county councillors also attended.

Some of the issues raised included a possible street party for the 80th Anniversary of VE Day celebrations over the Bank Holiday at the beginning of May. Nationally, a full programme of events has just been announced, and we are open to suggestions from residents for suitable celebrations in Stoke-sub-Hamdon.

Another resident asked about broken stiles and the possibility of a 'No Through Road' sign for the Old Fosse Way, which gets used as a detour when the A303 is closed or very slow. However, it causes more problems than it solves with vehicles then needing to turn around and pass others who have followed the crowd. County Councillor Pearlstone offered to take this up with Highways and it is worth remembering that parish council meetings provide a good opportunity to raise issues such as this directly with county councillors.



The clerk & Cllr Burton had inspected the Memorial Hall play area and are contacting suppliers about remedial works which will include cleaning up the basketball court and the boules court and ensuring that the surfaces are moss free. The same will be carried out at the Stonehill play area and then in the near future both will be ready for outdoor activity in time for the spring & summer months.

The recent campaign to ask for help to run the Hamdon Youth Family Centre (HYFC) was very successful and all roles have now been filled. A new injection of enthusiasm and energy will I'm sure take it forwards positively as the great facility that it is for residents.

Several planning applications were considered and plans for a Christmas Lights Working Group – a long lead time is required! Please see the separate notice on Facebook if you would like to help with this project. Less glamorously, Council also discussed waste removal and new & larger dog waste bins!

The next meeting of the parish council is on Wednesday 2nd April at 7pm in the Parish Office. There are currently two councillor vacancies, and the closing date to apply if you are interested in the role is Friday 28th March. Please contact the clerk to enquire

COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH

Our Community Speed Watch Team have now been collecting data for the past 6 months. We now intend to write a small progress report on the six months findings from both the Speed Indicator Device and the CSW Teams road side observations. Once completed this will be published on the Parish Council Web site and will help inform how the CSW Team moves forward.

We thank those of you who continue to be respectful of the speed limits, and of our efforts to improve the speeding on our roads. We would also like to thank those of you who have displayed the 20 is Plenty signs. I have had more requests for signs than were made up, so bear with us please.

The SID has been positioned on North Street in "blind" mode and the following findings are from the period 17 th February to 3 rd March. The speed limit is 30 mph with a school turning nearby. In total there were 13,707 vehicles passed the SID. 261 vehicles were recorded at Speeds over 31 mph, of which top speeds of 47 mph travelling towards the high street junction, and 48.2 mph travelling towards Great Field Lane.

WANTED - NEW VICAR! THE VACANCY PROCESS

Following Rev Nick's retirement at the end of last year, the process of choosing a new vicar has begun with the 7 PCCs across the Benefice meeting with the Bishop, Archdeacon and others to get the ball rolling. This process usually takes between one and two years but we are hoping to appoint a new vicar by early 2026.

We now have a team with a member from each parish to put together a Benefice Profile which tells any job seeking vicar who we are and who we are looking for. This profile will be finished in June, with job ads posted in July and interviews in September. If an appointment is made, then they could be licensed by the bishop in January 2026, but if we are unsuccessful first time, it will take longer. In the meantime, the church is kept going by the benefice administrator, a ministry

team of 3 vicars and 5 lay ministers (readers) and many volunteers filling the more than 50 roles on the activity list Rev Nick left us with.
