

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Parish Council meeting on 2nd April discussed the following topics:

ROAD ISSUES

Members of the public discussed the Speedwatch Group's latest findings, and the fact that they will be publishing some information on the Facebook page including the location of the 9 sites they are allowed to use in the village – but not when they will be there. The possibility of purchasing a Speed Indicator Device for shared use with one or two neighbouring parishes was also discussed.

A resident has offered to clean up the ham stone village sign at North St as you enter the village from the A303. They would also like to plant a trough with some flowers to enhance this aspect of the village. The clerk and our Somerset Council councillor will help by ensuring that Somerset Council processes for confirming permission for and obtaining a licence are followed. Hopefully this won't take too long, and you'll soon see a colourful display as you

enter Stoke-sub-Hamdon via North St.



Other items noted was the new pristine basketball court now cleared of surface moss (see picture below).

Councillors authorised the purchase of a replacement chain net for the hoop, and once the court markings are

repainted, the court will be ready for use again. The rest of the play area will also be cleaned of surface algae, and a new sign is being sourced. Sadly, the Stonehill play area requires a lot more work including new surface matting, but we will keep you updated with developments.

NEW PARKING CHARGES IN STOKE

Somerset Council is introducing charges at some previously free car parks, and the small car park on Ham Hill Road will soon have pay & display charges for parking between 8am & 6pm. The appropriate infrastructure needs to be installed, so it isn't yet in effect, but look out for notices. Other car parks in the area may also start charging for Sundays and overnight parking, but this is still under consultation.

MEETINGS

The next meeting of the Parish Council is on Wednesday 7th May at 7pm in the Parish Office. There are currently two councillor

vacancies, so if you are interested in becoming a councillor, please contact the clerk for further information.

Also, save the date for the Annual Parish Meeting taking place on Wednesday 22nd May at 7.00pm in the Memorial Hall. This is a meeting for village residents, organised by the Parish Council, to allow various clubs and societies to discuss their activities over the past year. Last year there were interesting contributions from the Village Art Club, the Community Shop, the Sports & Trust and the Performing Arts Group amongst others. Stoke-sub-Hamdon has an active community, and this is your opportunity to find out more about the many things that go in the village.

Our opening hours for the two May Bank Holidays will be 8-11am - allowing our volunteers to attend the May Fair.



STOKE HEALTH WALKS

CRIME ALERT

The Parish Council has been made aware of two worrying incidents in recent weeks. Firstly, there was a break in at the Ham Hill Visitor Centre works site. Heavy plant machinery including a generator were stolen which would have probably required a crane, so presumably it was a well-organised operation rather than an opportunistic event. The police have asked that anyone who can help provide information get in touch as soon as possible by calling 101.

Secondly, a resident reported finding a bolt from a crossbow type weapon in his garden. It was embedded in a plant pot near his back door, and on further inspection, was found to be a "STEAMBOW" which is one of the most "lethal bows" on the market. It is very concerning to think that possibly someone in the village has such a weapon and appears to have little care or control over safety when using it. This incident has been reported to the police. Again, if you have any useful information, please contact the police by calling 101.
