



PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The Parish Council met on Wednesday 10th December, having postponed the meeting by a week to allow for the formal lighting of the Christmas tree to coincide with Castle School's Advent Fair event. It was a lovely evening with carols sung by the children and even the rain held off.

The Christmas trees and lights were provided by the Parish Council but huge thanks go to Craig from True Tree Care who helped to put up most of the trees and brackets with his cherry picker; to Harry from Castle Farm Christmas Trees for supplying us with our lovely trees; to Tesco's at Yeovil for their donation of some Christmas lights; to Cliff and Jim for finishing off the trees on Sunday and helping the Parish Council through this process; to Florence from the Hive for coming to our rescue with an electricity supply; to Mark Lentell for concreting the post in for the flagpole tree; to Adrian Johnson for his help and advice and to Jake from Ham Hill Electrical Services for his advice and for installing the outdoor socket box. It was a steep learning curve for all concerned, but having done it once, and invested in various items, it will be bigger and better next year, and hopefully less stressful!

Other business included co-opting new Councillor, Gary Edmunds, to the Parish Council and an update from the Speedwatch Group. The survey of the War Memorial at Ham Hill had been carried out the same day and a condition report will follow in the new year.

COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH

The Speedwatch Team continue to work with the Parish Council and the Police to help reduce speeding in our community. We met with the Police for our Quarterly meeting and were told that as a result of the 97 sessions the Speedwatch team have done in the police have issued 501 letters to those who caught travelling at 36 MPH or over.

The fact that so many people speed past us, even though we are easy to see in our High Visibility Jackets, indicates some individuals disregard of the speed limits though our community. We are only out for one hour at a time, so when we are not visible you can only imagine how many others are speeding! Please make a conscious effort to travel within the 30MPH limit which applies to ALL our roads except by the schools when the lights are flashing, it then reduces to 20MPH.
